Last month, I went to the East Lake Recreation Center to advertise for our Vacation Bible School. The summer program director, Bucky Buckles, had asked me to bring him some flyers so that he could send them home with children. I had been to the rec center once before, but I didn't think that any of the kids would remember me. I had barely stepped out of my car when a little boy ran up to me, slipped his hand into mine and said, "You're going to be my partner." I was in the middle of East Lake Courts; feeling out of place, awkward, and conspicuous, but this little boy took me by the hand and dragged me right into his life. There were thirty more children just like him. *The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Ask the Lord of the Harvest to send more workers into the fields.*

Some weeks ago on Sunday morning, my wife Katie went to pick up a couple car loads of youth from a house on 13th Ave. One of the girls was waiting on the porch for her, and jumped in the front seat as soon as she pulled up. With bright eyes she explained to

Katie, "I learned this week that I can memorize verses from the Bible and have them with me wherever I go! So, I'm going to try to memorize the whole Bible!" This young women's zeal puts me to shame! Who will stand up and disciple her? *The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few. Ask the Lord of the Harvest to send more workers into the fields.*

I spent the afternoon with a young man who's been to our church and recently returned from Young Life camp. I asked him what he had learned about. "We learned about how Jesus was God's son and how Jesus took our sins so that if we believe in him we can be with God," he said. "That's great," I said, "but you've heard that before, right?" He looked at me and shook his head, "No. I'd never heard that before." I was shocked by his response. Who will explain the Gospel to the youth of East Lake? *The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few. Ask the Lord of the Harvest to send more workers into the fields.* -CALEB LONG

A Brief History of East Lake

Excerpted from the 2004 Rossville Boulevard Community Plan

“JUST AS EACH OF US HAS ONE BODY WITH MANY MEMBERS, AND THESE MEMBERS DO NOT ALL HAVE THE SAME FUNCTION, SO IN CHRIST WE WHO ARE MANY FORM ONE BODY, AND EACH MEMBER BELONGS TO ALL THE OTHERS. WE HAVE DIFFERENT GIFTS, ACCORDING TO THE GRACE GIVEN US.”

ROMANS 12:4-6

By 1887, “Charlie James’s belt line railroad [the Chattanooga Union Railway Belt Line] had opened new suburban opportunities” beyond Chattanooga’s city limits. The Mission Ridge Land Company, which James owned, began partitioning the area now known as East Lake into lots. East Lake and Fort Cheatham, as well as many of the other first suburbs, began to grow rapidly. The lake of East Lake was built around this time, fed by a spring above the park. Even though it was outside the city limits of Chattanooga, and would remain so for 28 years, East Lake Park was given to the City of Chattanooga in 1897. The City’s first zoo, Oxley Zoo, was located at the site. The zoo was composed of one camel, one bok (type of African antelope), two monkeys, one bear, and two wolves. Other attractions at the park included a bandstand, concession facilities, and the lake itself, which offered boat rides.

The 1900 Chattanooga city directory gave the population of East Lake as 544 and Ft. Cheatham as 466.

As today, industry played an important role in the early development of the Rossville Blvd area. Early industries of note included Milburn-Bass (later Chattanooga) Wagon Company, which manufactured wagons for the United States Army during the Spanish American War; Richmond Spinning Company, which would later become Cris-Craft (manufacturer of pleasure boats), and, in Fort Cheatham, the Chattanooga Coffin & Casket Company, which offered a range of coffins for sale from \$5 to \$200.

Rossville Blvd was first planned in 1907. It was constructed from the Chattanooga corporate limits to the Georgia state line at a cost of \$170,000.

ESL CLASSES

ESL: English as a second Language is a part of New City Fellowship East Lake's Latino Ministry. We seek to provide a multicultural community which impacts the academic, emotional, social, physical and spiritual lives of the Latinos in the East Lake community through mentoring relationships.

Once again I appreciate very much your prayer, help and financial support. By God's grace we had a great summer with ESL bible classes, outings, fiestas, graduations, and so on. I was so blessed in having the opportunity to work with the VBS, Bible Clubs, and Day Camp and see many lives open to see the love of Jesus thru His people.

This summer I was a challenged to think about people and ministry in a different way, and to listen and understand the voice of God telling me to be patient and to put my trust in Him.

We had nearly 5-8 students participating at the Sunday school, sometimes only 2 (Teaching English from the Bible: Book of Mark.) We had the assistance of new wonderful volunteers; I was overwhelmed with the generosity of the Hixson small group who provided the breakfast every Sunday.

I can not believe how summer went so fast and know I am helping the Latino's parents with registration for their kids at school and with the purchase of school uniforms and supplies.

Another thing that we have been doing is outreach to the Latino community at East Lake Park for the last several weeks of the month of August in the evenings.

It has been a blessing to meet some Latinos interested in taking English classes and also it has been so encouraging to see the volunteers coming at night and share the Love of God while hanging out in the community. We've seen the Hand of God protecting us during our outreach times. These times have helped us become more aware of the problems and needs in our community and how the church may be able to assist.

I feel I need to share this: during our last outreach at the park we witnessed an incident of gang violence which made us more aware of how we need to pray for peace in the community. At that moment I felt very concerned and even afraid for the safety of the group but the Lord reminded us that He is in control and we started praying in a safe location. God is good all the time!

I would like to begin a program at New City East Lake in our Latino ministry were one family or in individual adopts

WHAT WE ARE DOING

Youth Club

We are going to be starting a weekly meeting time where youth can come and hang out, play games, eat food, and build relationships with members of our church. This will happen every Thursday night from 7:00pm-8:30pm at East Lake United Methodist Church.

How You Can Help: We need volunteers to be in charge of food, to plan and run group games, set-up and clean-up, pick up and drop off youth, lead small group discussion time, and just be there to hang out!

Youth Church

On Sunday mornings during the greeting time we dismiss the youth to a time of teaching that is hopefully more relevant to where they are spiritually and developmentally. During this time we play a game, have a time of teaching and discussion, and have refreshments. We will meet every Sunday except for the last Sunday of the month, where we will ask the youth to stay in the service to help them to be-

gin to feel more comfortable in our church's setting.

How You Can Help: We need volunteers to lead the teaching/discussion time, lead the game, bring food for about 15 people, and just be there for crowd control. We also need 2 or 3 people each week to pick up and drop off the youth at their homes.

Hang Out in The Park

We want to continue to meet more youth in the community and one way that we can do this is by hanging out in the East Lake Park. The idea is that a few people would just bring a frisbee, soccer ball, football, etc. and start a pickup game with teenagers that are hanging around. From there, hopefully it would be easier to then invite them to our Thursday night Youth Club and begin to draw them into our ministries.

How You Can Help: Choose a Saturday and a couple of friends and just show up at the park! We will have flyers that you can take with you to hand out about our Youth Club.



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

The Children's Ministry of New City East Lake focuses on the evangelism and discipleship of our children from birth through fifth grade. This includes children of our members and those who are brought into our Church through community outreach programs.

It is such a blessing to watch our children study and learn God's word. There is nothing more exciting than seeing a child connect what is written in the scriptures with their lives and realize that they are an important part of the kingdom of God.

New City East Lake was established in the fall of 2008 when New City Fellowship in Glenwood established a second worship site.

New City East Lake seeks to be a cross-cultural worshipping community, ministering to all people, rich and poor, young and old. We seek to be centered in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, producing disciplined believers who become God's instruments of grace, justice, and mercy.

As a PCA congregation, we believe in the full inspiration of the Scriptures and attempt to preach the whole counsel of God and minister to the whole person.

EAST LAKE HISTORY CONT.

Newspaper accounts of the time note that the boulevard was intended to be "a perpetual war monument," and that it would be forever maintained memory of the armies that once marched along its path. By 1917 the badly neglected boulevard was difficult to travel on and Hamilton County proposed a median strip to minimize the area to be maintained. East Lake and surrounding neighborhoods defeated annexation referenda in 1921 and 1923 but narrowly approved annexation August 18, 1925. East Lake underwent neighborhood revitalization in the late 1960's, along with Orchard Knob and Highland Park. In 1981 the movie *The Night the Lights Went Out in Georgia* was filmed in part along Rossville Blvd.
